2025 Australian All Schools Athletics Championships Melbourne December 4-7th

AA Report

Walking his way to gold, Samuel Lindsay (TAS) celebrated a win in style with a personal best, a meet record and a World Under 20 Championships qualifying time of 20:07.71 in the Under 18 5000m walk. Finishing more than 36 seconds ahead of silver medallist Sebastian Richards (SA), Lindsay took down the meet record of Olympian Declan Tingay from 2016, while Richards too clocked a time under the 20:50.00 world junior qualifying mark with 20:44.91.

Continuing the race walking action, Ela Uzun (VIC) torched the Under 17 meet record in the 5000m Race Walk despite being just 15-years-old, taking down her Under 18 rivals as well in the combined event as she walked to a time of 22:55.80. Erasing the former meet record of 23:55.80, the Victorian won by a margin of almost three minutes – securing gold for the locals: “I enjoyed moving up an age group because I really enjoy the 5k, which is one of my favourite events. I was confident that I could win and I wanted to go at my own pace, I felt good at it and I kept it up for the whole race,” Uzun said.

Congratulations to our Queensland walkers for their great results at the **Australian All Schools Athletics Championships** in Melbourne winning a total of seven medals and Australian Schools titles to Noah & Milly. There were also seven pb’s achieved by Queensland walkers.

Looking Back 30 years ago

1995

In 1995 the QRWC broke the race-walking 24-hour relay world record with 284km at the fund raiser for the 1996 Olympics held on the main track at QSAC. There were about 20 other running teams participating with tents set up on the grass in the middle of the stadium.

A second team of mostly junior race walkers from the Redlands Athletics Club walked a commendable 224 km to finish in second place in the walk category. Many believed they should have been disqualified for loudly playing the Macarena on repeat all night. Participants walked a 1km leg which was half a lap of the track then out onto the ring road for an out and back circuit and finishing back in the stadium. Among the participants were dual Olympian Dave Smith, Anthony Miles, Iggy Jimenez, Andrew Ludwig, Shane Pearson, Teresa Leatherby, Jason Moore, Sue Miles & Peter Bennett. The Redlands teams included the Biggs and Houston families and a young Sarah Vardenega. It was hard work. Just think of having to reel off fast 1km reps every hour for 24 hours.

In 1996 the club broke their own record with 294km at the QRWC fund raiser for the Queensland Epilepsy Foundation. The club put on a long-distance walking carnival which incorporated a 24-hour endurance walk, shorter walking races and a 24 hour walk relay event. The team of 15 walked 294 km to claim a new world record breaking their previous record by 10km. Caleb Maybir become a Centurion by walking 100 miles in under 24 hours and Peter Bennett broke the Australian 100km record (10 hours 51 minutes).

Australian 20km Championship Bruce Stadium, Canberra, Saturday 18th March 1995

AA changed the start time but forgot to tell the chief judge!!

The Australian men's 20km championship, the women's 10km championship and the U20 10km championships were held in Canberra on Saturday 18th March, 2 weeks after the National T&F Championships. The meet ended up with its share of controversy, with Athletics Australia insisting on holding the walks on the AIS/Bruce Stadium course even though the Brisbane Raiders Rugby Team were listed to play that night. Nine days before the

races, AA changed the start time from 2:45pm to 8am (for men) and 9am (for women), but forgot to tell their chief judge Jill Huxley, who arrived from Ballina at 12 noon! The ACT Walkers Club had suggested the Mandaring Drive course but their suggestion had fallen on deaf ears. The races started and finished at the AIS track, with walkers doing laps around the outside of the old Bruce Stadium.

This will allow athletes wishing to compete at QA events representing QRWC, to take out a combined QRWC/QA membership in or after October each year. Once registered, athletes can represent QRWC at the various QA competitions held throughout the year, including the QA Road Walking Championships, QA Shield Meets and Qld Athletics Championships. Please note that QA offers 3 levels of membership.

Rules of Race Walking

There are two basic rules in Race Walking:

- *Contact: The athlete must never have both feet off the ground at once.*
- *Knees: The advancing leg must be straightened (not bent at the knee) from when the foot first makes contact with the ground until the vertical upright position.*

Blue Cards

As part of our legal obligations and a condition of our affiliation with QA we must maintain a current Blue Card register. We have a duty to be fully aware of exactly who is coaching or providing services to our members, particularly when those members include children or young people under 18.

Equally important is ensuring that every coach or provider engaged in child-related activities holds a current and valid Blue Card, as required under Queensland legislation.

This is not only a matter of compliance, but also a fundamental part of maintaining a safe and trusted environment for all participants. Our club will continue to ensure that we are meeting our duty of care and fulfilling and our legal obligations under the Working with Children (Risk Management and Screening) Act 2000.
